

## SENIOR SURVEY

An annual survey of graduating seniors was initiated in Spring 2014. Survey invitations are extended to all graduating seniors during the month preceding commencement. Students rate their satisfaction of their learning related to both College level general education and program level learning outcomes. Students are also asked to rate their satisfaction with their program of study and various campus resources. Students also provide information related to their future plans upon graduation.
